

Circle City Veterinary Specialty and Emergency Hospital is participating in a clinical drug trial beginning the end of July. This study is evaluating the efficacy of a new drug Pfizer has developed to control allergic dermatitis in the dog. The clinical trial lasts four months. Required examinations during this period are minimal. The owner will be responsible for the initial \$120 consultation fee if we have not already established a client/patient relationship.

Requirements for this study include, but are not limited to:

- Food allergy must be ruled out or controlled on a hypoallergenic diet.
- Pet is on flea control prior to enrollment.
- Pet has been receiving antigen injections for at least 1 year or has discontinued them for 8 weeks prior to enrollment.

****Please call our hospital for additional withdrawal times prior to enrollment if the pet is/has taken any kind of a steroid, cyclosporine, tacrolimus, antihistamines or any antimicrobials within the last 6 weeks.**

Benefits to your patient/client:

If the pet qualifies for the study and the owner is compliant with all study protocol/procedures, they will be provided:

- Bloodwork to assess the health of their pet
- Clinical examinations and a dermatological assessment at each visit
- Flea and heartworm prevention
- A monetary credit to their account at Circle City

Risks of the study:

The risks associated with the study are minimal and will be discussed in depth if you wish to pursue the study.
